During Enrollment Day on November 16, 2013, consumers will be able to speak directly with Outreach Educators and Enrollment Counselors to receive the information necessary to make the right choice for their family or business coverage. The event runs from 9 am to 2 pm. Consumers can apply on site at any of the 4 locations below. There is no cost to attend and refreshments will be available. Everyone in need should take advantage of the free services that will also include health screenings.

1. W-2 or last years tax return, birth certificate or legal resident card
2. Proof of US citizenship/residency status, social security number
3. Proof of property/assets such as current bank statement, vehicle registration
4. Information needed to enroll family members, number of people enrolling, birth dates, social security numbers, and home zip code.
