Dr. Carl Hart from Columbia University to address Modern Day Drug Addiction in Relation to Health and Poverty in the African American Community in Sacramento

SACRAMENTO (March 21) – The 8th annual Northern California Black Physicians Forum (BPF) will take place on Friday, March 23, 2018 at the UC Davis School of Medicine – Education Building, 4610 X Street, in Sacramento, California from 5:30 – 9:30 pm.

The purpose of the BPF is to connect physicians, clinicians, medical students, health care and public health professionals with colleagues throughout Northern California to discuss physician leadership and collaborative roles in chronic disease treatment, prevention, and access to healthcare.

“Sac Cultural Hub Media Foundation annually hosts the Black Physicians Forum as a call to action. Black Physicians leadership changes social norms by increasing community awareness and developing solutions for health disparities. Strong physicians’ leadership is also essential for solving health inequities in care and offers collaborative opportunities for physician-led reform of traditional and nontraditional treatment. Additionally, physicians’ knowledge and first hand perspective of medical education financing, health information, coverage and technology implementation are powerful factors to shape legislation. Black healthcare and public health professional add credibility and strengthen the viability of these reforms in the professional and public arenas for the African American community.” - stated Twlia Laster, Strategic Marketing Director, Sac Cultural Hub Media Foundation.

This year’s topic of discussion is "Modern Day Drug Addiction in Relation to Health and Poverty in the African American Community". UC Davis Chancellor Dr. Gary May and Dr. Hendry Ton, Interim Associate Vice Chancellor for Diversity and Inclusion at UC Davis Health, stated: “the Black Physicians Forum is vitally importance for addressing the social determinants that contribute to the health of the African American Community. We must examine the impact of bias, poverty, and policy on drug addiction and its treatment, and identify positive approaches that providers and communities can use to transform our systems of care to truly achieve health equity.”
